Working from home plans for Reception

Staff have been working hard to create the next proposed plan for you to work on with your child if they are learning at home. Here is a suggested plan for spreading out learning over the **next two** week period. There are three activities each day and they have been based on what the children attending class are currently learning in school.

Please continue to upload your amazing home activities weekly onto Tapestry.

These do not have to be linked to the suggested activities below, but can be of any experience at home e.g. exploring in the garden, helping to prepare dinner or playing with a sibling. We really enjoy seeing these observations and it also helps us to know you are safe and well.

Phonics	<p>Sound Hunt.</p> <p>Write all of the sounds we have learnt this year into pieces of paper. Can all the sounds be hidden around your home/outside. How many can you find? Can you tell the adult what the sounds are?</p>	<p>Cross the river.</p> <p>Ask an adult to write some words on pieces of paper that include set 2 sounds such as, 's<u>ou</u>nd' 'c<u>ro</u>w' etc. These are now the stepping stones to cross the river. You must read the word on each stepping stone you stand on to get to the other side of the river.</p>	<p>Review all the phonic sounds. How many did you remember? It's important that you keep learning these sounds.</p> <p>Find your favourite toy. Can you use your phonetic knowledge to write a descriptive sentence about your toy, and say why it is your favourite.</p>	<p>Hopscotch</p> <p>Outside using chalk on the floor or inside using paper, can you make a hopscotch. Ask an adult to help you to write words that include set 2 sounds inside the hop scotch. Read the words to be able to jump into the next box.</p>	<p>Recap red words.</p> <p>Put the red words on the floor and use something around the house e.g. a spatula to splat the red words. When the adult calls out the red word you need to find it and splat it.</p>
Maths	<p>Use the number cards you have made before, or make some new ones, to order them to 20.</p> <p>Roll a ball along the line and see where it stops. Can you find what one less than this number is? You could use some objects to show what is happening? E.g if the ball lands on 5, get 5 cubes then take one cube away to find what one less is.</p>	<p>Chopper Squad game - One more, one less to 20.</p>	<p>Using your numberline, can you find two less of a random number? Again, use some objects to help you with this.</p>	<p>Ten Green Bottles</p> <p>Find some objects such as bottles or toys to act as our bottles. Sing the ten green bottles song and take away one of your objects each time.</p> <p>Can you make your own version of the song by taking away more than one green bottle at a time? Or try and sing '10 fat sausages sizzling in a pan'.</p>	<p>Pass it on - at least 2 players</p> <p>Each player starts with 6 cubes/objects. Each player takes turns rolling the dice. They have to give away the number of cubes on the dice to the person to their left. The player to give away all of their cubes is the winner. Try to count how many cubes you are giving away each time and how many you have left.</p>

Topic	Go noodle dancing Get active and practise your dance moves by copying some dance videos.	Outdoor collage Go on a walk and collect materials such as grass, twigs, leaves etc. Use these materials to make a picture of something you saw outside. How will you use your items?	Update your plant diary. Can you share the progress of your plant on Tapestry?	What are you proud about? What have you done today, this week, this month, this year, that makes you feel proud?	Cosmic Kids Yoga Practise some gentle exercises and stretches along to a story.
