

If you are feeling *musical* you could ...

- Learn a new song called, 'When Goldilocks went to the house of the bears' <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PFXE3zvXbjc>

If you are feeling *curious* you could...

- Taste some porridge with different toppings.
- Find out more about your family and have discussions around which food or story book is their favourite?
- Go on a walk into some local woods with an adult. What interesting things can you find? Which sounds can you hear? Can you see any evidence of any animal homes e.g. a bird's nest or badger sett?

If you like using *technology* you could ...

If you are feeling *creative* you could...

- Make masks of the different characters in 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears'.
- Read some traditional tales and then use some of the characters and events to make up your own imaginative story e.g. The Gingerbread man grew some magic beans, at the top of the beanstalk was the big bad wolf.
- Draw yourself as a story character and practise writing your name underneath.

Project based learning – Traditional Tales

If you are interested in *literacy*, you could...

- Read the story of Goldilocks and the 3 Bears. Can you join in with what the bears say?
- Make a list of other books you have looked at which have a bear in them.
- Practise finding words which rhyme with bear e.g. hair.

If you are interested in *maths*, you could...

- Count all the teddy bears in your house and then put your teddy bears in size order from biggest to smallest.
- Set up a teddy bear's picnic and put out some plates, cups and food. Can you share them equally? How many does each teddy have?
- Play a maths game and practise maths skills as well as taking turns e.g. play dominoes, bingo, Uno, Jenga.
- Explore outside or in your house and complete a number hunt. What numbers did you see? Have a focus on recognising numbers 1 to 3.
