

Year Two Newsletter

Our driving question is: How would life be similar and different if we grew up in Chembakoli, India?

Literacy

To start the term we will look at the book 'Pattan's Pumpkin'. We will investigate the book, understanding how the author captures the reader's attention and inferring how characters are feeling in the story. Moving on from this, the children will then be learning a wishing story, based on 'The Snowman' by Raymond Briggs. They will create story maps and use actions to help them remember the order. We will then look at how to make our writing interesting to read with lots of effective description, using adjectives, for example: frozen, cold, icy, and story openers such as 'On a cold winter's night ' and 'One frosty morning'.

Ideas for at home: *Can you have a go at telling someone at home 'The Snowman' story?*

Handwriting - We are having a big push on handwriting and will now be learning to write in the cursive style. Help children by showing them how to form letters correctly, including in their homework books.

Numeracy

This term we will be looking at mental and written methods for adding and subtracting any two digit number e.g. $34 + 45$, $43 - 22$.

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Following on from this, we will be looking at money.

PE

The children have two PE sessions a week. In PE we will be looking at dance, thinking about how we can use our bodies to express emotion. We will be linking it to our India work and looking at Bollywood dancing. We will also be continuing to look at ball skills and applying these in games, being able to follow rules.

Both classes will have PE lessons on a Monday and Friday. We do our best to stick to these days but sometimes they have to change at the last minute. To help us out, please could your child's PE kit be in school all week. At the moment, most lessons are outside so please ensure your child has black tracksuit trousers and a black plain jumper especially as the weather gets colder.

PE kit should be a white t-shirt, black coloured shorts, black tracksuit trousers, black jumper and trainers or plimsolls. Make sure all their kit is labelled with clearly and is kept in a named bag in a box. There will be a lost property basket in the cloakroom

Creative Curriculum

We will be learning all about India and the village of Chembakoli. We will be finding out all about where India is in the world and where the village of Chembakoli is. We will be discovering how life in Chembakoli is similar and different to life for a child in Banbury.

In Science, we will be looking at different materials, their properties and their uses.

In Art this term, we will be looking at different artists: Kandinsky, Klimt, Monet and Bush and we will study the style of art work from these artists and even try and replicate some of their work. We will also be looking at some Indian art linked to Rangoli patterns and henna designs. At the end of the term, we will be having our own art gallery with the work that we have produced.

E-Safety

This term we will be looking at apps and games – recognising which are age appropriate and recognising what information is safe to put online and what is not. We will also discuss how we can keep personal information safe when using the internet.
