Driving question: How could the Great Fire of London have been prevented?

Literacy

How will I be able to tell the difference between pieces of work that are inspired by Andy Goldsworthy and Van Gough. During this term we will be learning our version of the story 'The Gruffalo' in Literacy. We will be learning this story orally and then working on re-writing a new version to practise our skills in order to make sure the stories we write have a clear beginning, middle and end. We will be continuing to focus on using punctuation, such as full stops and capital letters, in the correct places when writing and making sure our handwriting is neat and in cursive script. We will be reading Anthony Browne texts including Where the Wild things are and Lost and Found as our class novel this term.

Maths

In maths this term we will have a focus on number. We will learn how to **count to 20**, practice our counting skills, ordering, reading and writing numbers too. We will also be learning about 2D and 3D shapes, as well as patterns, length and ordinal numbers.

At home: please can your practise reciting the number bonds to 10 with your child, they could do this by saying them aloud, writing them down, making posters to represent the different ways of showing the number bond. If your child is secure with their number bonds to 10, please focus on number bonds to 20. Number bonds to 10 include: 1+9, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6, 5+5 and 10+0. Creative Curriculum

At the beginning of the term we will be focussing on history by learning about the Great Fire of London. We will be learning about significant events which happened during the fire and the impact this has had on our lives today. This term we are having a big art focus in Creative Curriculum lessons, so we will be learning about patterns and using objects from the environment to create sculptures and different pieces of art work. We are also going to be researching and comparing the works of the artists Vincent Van Gogh and Andy Goldsworthy. The children will create their own pieces of amazing art work in the style of these artists.

In Science, we will also be learning about different animal groups such as amphibians, reptiles and mammals. We will find out what these animals eat to determine whether they are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores. At home, it would be great if you could explore the scientific vocabulary around this theme.
