Covid-19 and Lockdown Updates

- The latest guidance for parents/carers with children at school can be found at: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/what-parents-and-carers-need-to-know-about-early-years-providers-schools-and-colleges-during-the-coronavirus-covid-19-outbreak. This includes the 10 day new isolation period and an update on the end of key stage assessments (Year 2's are cancelled as tests and the spelling and grammar ones in Year 6 are also cancelled).
- If your child **develops symptoms** up until and including **Saturday 19th December 2020**, you must **email** either Mrs Rogers or Mrs Gordon-Weeks on: principal@dashwood-aspirations.org or sgordon-weeks@dashwood-aspirations.org This is so we can be on standby should we need to contact anyone for track and trace. (Please do not email the office address as this will not be checked everyday.) If they develop symptoms after the 19th or if it is someone else in the household who develops symptoms during that time, you will not need to email us as it will not affect anyone at school in terms of potential isolating. Thank you for supporting us with this.
- Please continue to keep your child off school if they show symptoms, are ill or if they live with
 someone who is showing symptoms and waiting on a test/result. This means they should not
 attend school until a result has come through which is either negative, or they have completed the
 appropriate isolation period if it is positive. No one should be in school if someone in the house has
 had a test until you know the result. This rule has been in place since March 2020 and has not
 changed. Thank you.
- Those who are eligible for **Free School Meals** (different to Universal Free School meals) have been given a link to a Winter Grant food scheme to provide lunches for your child over the holidays.

Health and Safeguarding

- Please ensure that you stay safe over the holidays and stick to all rules and regulations around mixing. - Online activities: remember to monitor all websites and games your child uses. We have heard of
