

# YEAR 3 NEWSLETTER

*Driving Question: How can we preserve our waterways to ensure they have a sustainable future?*

## **Achievements for this term**

Firstly, the children came back to school enthusiastically and fully immersed themselves in our Ancient Egyptian topic where they have delved into the historical time period and researched different aspects including mummification and the River Nile. The children developed their teamwork skills when creating their own Egyptian medicine and packaging. In addition to this, the children have learnt how to set up a successful fair test, and how to answer scientific questions based on their findings.

## **Literacy**

This term we will be practising our persuasive skills, persuading others to keep themselves safe around water. As a class we will be reading *Wind in the Willows*. We are very excited to focus some of our Literacy sessions on poetry including shape poems and a performance poem. Further to this, we will be enhancing our story writing skills through writing a warning story using 'The Barn'.

At home you could: Use 'Lexia' aiming for 60 minutes a week, practise your weekly spellings, encourage children to read regularly and share books with your child.

## **Maths**

This term we will be focussing on fractions with an initial recap of arithmetic in the first week. To support your child at home you could continue to practise their times tables regularly and rapidly recalling addition and subtraction number facts under 20. You could also work on finding equivalent fractions and fractions of amounts e.g.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of 20.

## **Science**

This term we will be learning about light. We will start by discussing why we need light, what darkness is explaining that light is reflected from surfaces. We will then be applying this knowledge to investigate how reflections and shadows are formed and can be changed as well as looking at the dangers of direct sunlight and how we can keep ourselves protected. ## **Geography**

As well as a big focus on water safety we will be learning about rivers and canals. This will include physical features, uses and facts about famous rivers. We will also be looking into the causes and effects of water pollution and the impact of flooding.
