Health and Safety

- As always, your child(ren)'s safety inside and outside of school is paramount to us. With this in mind, it is important to remember that when dropping off and collecting, you are following all safety laws. We strongly encourage you to **park away** from school and walk/cycle/scoot in. The local police last year supported us in ensuring people park safely and this is something they will continue this year. - Pupils should have water only in their bottles please to support good oral hygiene.
- Please remember we are a **nut free school** so no nuts should come on site at any time. We have pupils and staff with severe allergies.
- Covid reminder: if anyone in your household has symptoms of Covid, they must have a PCR test (not a lateral flow) and isolate. This means the person who has symptoms should not enter the school site at any time. We continue to recommend face coverings during drop off and collection times as these are crowded and very busy.

Key information and reminders

- <u>What's New and Different meetings:</u> a pre-recorded meeting will be sent to you via text and placed on our website within the next week or two so you know what to expect in your child(ren)'s year group this year. This will include information about the curriculum, trips and any assessments taking place.
- <u>Hot shots basketball club:</u> pupils in years 3-6 will take part in hot shots basketball taster sessions this week and have the opportunity to sign up to attend the club (ran by the external club Hot Shots and paid directly to them).
- <u>Clubs</u>: within the next two weeks, you will be sent a link to sign your child up to one of our free after school clubs! We are so pleased to have these up and running again soon.
- <u>Tuck shop:</u> this will be available in the next few weeks and open to pupils in Years 2-6 during break times on Monday's, Wednesday's and Friday's. Pupils should being no more than £1 in to purchase up to 2 healthy snack items. Most items are between 30-50p each. We will let you know the exact start date for this.
- <u>Parent's evenings</u>: these will take place the week beginning 4th October and be conducted over the phone. Sign up texts will be sent out in a few weeks.
- <u>Photo day</u>: on Thursday 21st October, individual and sibling school photos will take place.
- <u>Uniform</u>: thank you so much to the majority of you for fully complying with our uniform policy and ensuring the children have returned looking so smart. Just a reminder to the few who were still corting this that all pupils in Years 1.6 must have a

sorting this that, all pupils in Years 1-6 must have a blazer in school daily, wear a tie with a school shirt (not a polo shirt) unless wearing a green and white dress and they must all wear black school shoes (not trainers). PE kits should now be in school and kept in school. These are all white and black – no other colours are permitted but the PE kit does not need to have our logo on it.

 <u>Hair accessories</u>: a reminder these should be discrete and in either school or natural colours. Long hair should be tied up.
