

Nursery Newsletter

Welcome back to Term 2! We have lots of exciting things happening this term for Plum class pupils.

- We will have **Forest School outdoor learning sessions on a Friday** - Children will need to come dressed in old, warm clothes with wellies in a named bag on this day. They tend to get quite muddy!

Topic: How could we plan an enjoyable celebration for all the children in our class?

Our topic this term is 'celebrations'. We will be working together to plan a celebration for all the children in our class. We will be learning about the story Elmer and talking about colour and shape. The children will also be learning other stories such as, 'The day the crayons quit', 'Brown Bear what do you see' and 'The Jolly Christmas Postman'. We will be starting our topic with a Bonfire Night story and talking about different colours we might see in fireworks!

Our Focus questions this term:

Week 1: What can you see? What can you hear?

Week 2: Can you describe Elmer? How is Elmer feeling?

Week 3: What colour can you use? What shape would work best?

Week 4: What sounds can you hear?

Week 5: What changes have you seen? How has the environment changed?

Week 6: What do you know about Christmas?

Week 7: Can you talk about the Nativity story?

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be helping the children to recognise and talk about feelings such as sadness, happiness or feeling cross. We will be linking this to our behaviour policy which focuses on the Zones of Regulation. Linking to the character of Elmer in our story, we will encourage children to notice how

others are feeling and how to help or comfort them. The children will also take part in activities that require collaboration, for example ring games and nursery rhymes such as 'Row, row, row your boat.'



Communication and Language, Reading and Writing

Sharing rhymes, books and stories is an important aspect of Plum class. The children will begin to say repeated phrases in stories and they will join in with actions from songs. We will prompt children's thinking and discussion through involvement in their play, talking about what they have been doing and helping them to reflect upon and explain events. As the term progresses, the pupils will begin to recite our key story of the term – Elmer - focusing on the key story language which is written in bold on our model text (see below).

Physical Development

There will be plenty of opportunities to develop gross motor skills in Term 2. In our outdoor area and Forest School sessions, a range of large play equipment will be provided that can be used in different ways, such as boxes, ladders and balance beams. During PE sessions we will also be learning to use the large climb-


ing equipment safely. To improve fine motor skills, the children will experiment with a variety of mark making materials and resources such as scissors, jugs and threading. We will also be practising to hold our pencils correctly and use them to draw pictures and begin to write some letters from our names.

Phase 1 phonics


The foundations of phonics begins long before children learn to read and write letters and words. In Nursery we will be introducing the children to phonics. During this term, we will be continuing to develop the children's listening skills and sound discrimination through games and activities. Forest School

Every **Friday** we will continue to attend our weekly Forest School sessions, which take place in our wildlife area on school grounds. We ask that children come to Nursery in old clothes, that you don't mind getting muddy, and have wellies in a bag with the children's names on. To help us get ready in good time for Forest School, please can you help your child to practise taking off and putting on their shoes, socks and coats independently at home.



Expressive Arts and Design



As our topic suggests, we will focus on the arts and looking at colour. We will learn the names of all colours, look for colour patterns in the environment, what colours are used for specific things and colour mixing. This will be encompassed in a dressing up day where the children can come to school dressed in their favourite colour (or colours!). Towards the end of the term, we will focus on learning the songs for our Christmas performance!

Maths

During our maths carpet sessions we will continue to look at recognising numbers and practise counting accurately. We will also look at shapes, by naming them and begin to talk about properties. Here is a website link to a game you could play:

Understanding the World

This term we will be discussing our families and looking at how we all take part in different traditions and celebrations. We will begin by looking at Bonfire Night and end the term looking at Christmas.

We will be looking at stories that will support the children with this and will continue to discuss the need for supervision when on sites such as YouTube. Activities to do at home

- Can you challenge your child by encouraging them to move in different ways? Can they jump, hop, skip? How long can they balance on one leg?
- Play some simple turn taking games, for example; 'snap', 'pairs/memory', 'hide and seek', 'dominoes', 'uno' or taking turns to kick a football.
- Share your favourite stories and rhymes from your childhood. These can be in English or from another culture, particularly where children are learning English as an additional language.
- Begin to get your child 'school ready' by ensuring they know how to sit at a table to eat their food and use a knife and fork appropriately.
