Topic for Term 3:

That's Not My

Personal, social and emotional development:

This term we will be welcoming in new children and helping them to settle. We will be exploring indoors and outside and help them to become more independent.

Communication, language, reading and writing

This term we will be sharing books from 'That's Not My ...' Series by Fiona Watt and will be looking at new vocabulary to describe different textures. Each book introduces a new animal, vehicle or character, with bright illustrations, simple, repetitive story lines and lots of touchy-feely textures to get children engaging with books from a young age. We will be reading traditional stories and singing traditional rhymes, together with songs with actions. We will be providing the children with lots of mark making opportunities throughout the session to put on display. Physical development

We will be singing number songs with the children and supporting their understanding of what numbers are by playing what the time Mr Wolf and hide and seek. We be looking at numbers and shapes in the environment. We will be using our number line to recognise numbers 0-5.

Knowledge and understanding of the world

We will be discussing textures and learning new words to describe them. We will link our books to our small world area for the children to explore. We will continue our weekly visits to forest school on a **Wednesday**.

Expressive arts and design

The Cherry Class love to join in with ring games and dancing and we will be looking at how instruments sound.
