Our topic for the term: **Help! Focusing on heroes and history.**

Driving Question: How can we improve our school to make sure everyone's health is looked after?

Literacy

Our new text for the term is '**People who help us.**' We will be learning this information text over the next few weeks then the children will be writing their own. We have provided a copy of the text for you to share at home. Look out for alliteration in the text; when the words all start with the same sounds e.g. shiny star, shimmers. We will discuss the importance of people who help us and why they are everyday heroes. This will include their job role, their uniform and the transport and equipment they may use. The children will also become historians and will write their own reports to compare hospitals and the role of nurses past and present. We will also be ensuring we always use the correct punctuation at the end of a sentence (full stop, exclamation mark or a question mark.)

At home: Remember to read your books daily and use Lexia at least once a week for twenty minutes.

Numeracy

In maths this term we are going to look at addition and subtraction to 20 and beyond once secure. We will then focus on the days of the week and towards the end of the term we will revisit counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.

PE and Forest School

As you know, PE slots are as follows: **Holly class on Wednesday and Hazel class on a Monday.** Please make sure you are sending your child with warm P.E. clothes for our outdoor sessions including black jumpers, jogging bottoms, trainers and socks. Can you also ensure that your child is not wearing earrings on PE days please. This term we will be learning to sequence moves using apparatus in our indoor PE sessions. In outdoor PE, we are practising our ball skills through playing basic team games and we will be using rackets to show control in our movements. As you know, Forest School slots will stay the same this term: **Holly class on a Monday and Hazel class on a Wednesday.** Please make sure that your child has brought in their Forest School clothes, wellingtons and a waterproof coat with their names on.

Creative Curriculum

Our focus will primarily be history. We are going to learn about the Crimean War and how Florence Nightingale (like the 'nice nurse' in our information text) saved many soldiers. We will find out about her life and how her actions have improved hospitals today. The children will need to be able to use the terms: history, past, present, war, soldier, hospital. We are also going to talk about other people who help us like policemen, firemen and post officers. We hope to get a few visitors in to talk to the children about their jobs.
