## Literacy

We will begin the term with performance poetry, where we will be discussing, learning and performing a pirate poem. Later on, in the term we will be learning the story **'The Lighthouse Keeper's Cat.'** We will be learning our version of this lost and found story over the next few weeks then the children will be writing their own. We have provided a copy of the story for you to share at home. Look out for the whole range of punctuation, including exclamatory sentences. These will be a particular focus for us. We will also be having a big push on spelling rules and patterns to make sure that children are applying these in their writing.

## Maths

This term we will be finishing our topic on fractions before going on to explore measurement in different forms. We will be focusing on length & height, then time, as well as mass, capacity and temperature. We will be looking at ordering and measuring in centimetres and metres. At home you could support this by asking children to measure things around the house. In our time topic, we will be focusing on telling the time to 5 minutes. You could support this by asking the children to tell the time at random times of the day and practicing their 5 times tables so that they can see the link. In mass, capacity and temperature, we will be focusing on how to measure according to grams and kilograms as well as litres and millilitres. You could support this at home by identifying how much things weigh in the shop or getting your child to help you with cooking a measuring ingredients at home,

**At home:** You can also use Pixl or Times Table Rockstars to help practice times tables. Please let us know if you need your child's login details again so that you can access them.

## PE

This is an exciting term for both classes as it's the lead up to sports day! For our outside sessions (every Friday and alternate Tuesdays) we will be practising the athletics skills we will need in order to do well in sports day! Both classes will also continue to have an indoor PE slot to learn dances for some of our pirate songs and to play ball games. These will be on alternate Tuesdays.

## Creative Curriculum

Our focus subject will primarily be History over the first few weeks where we will be focusing on the similarities and differences of attending Dashwood now and in 1902. Our focus will then move to science. Pupils will be learning about different animals and their habitats. We will first identify what living things need to survive and then we will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, noticing how these habitats are suited to the animals' survival. We will also look at some experiments, observing what we can see and writing up our findings. After this, we will focus our learning towards Geography, where we will recap some of our knowledge about the 7 continents from term 1, before comparing life at the seaside with life in Banbury.

## E – Safety

To round off the year, children will be recapping all of the important information they now know about how to stay safe online. They will discuss what you should do if you see something online that makes you feel sad or worried and also think about why age restrictions are important.
