Term 6 - Leadership and Enterprise

Year 5 have 3 units of learning this term:

Driving Question: How can we, as entrepreneurs, create a product that is environmentally friendly?

Outcome: A product to sell at the enterprise event.

Driving Question: In what ways are the life cycles of humans and animals similar and different?

Outcome: Create a magazine article.

Driving Question: What makes me who I am? How can I use and develop my personal qualities and help me manage change?

Outcome: Make a toolkit to support transition to Year 6.

Term 5 Achievements

Year 5 worked had a great learning journey in term 5. They enjoyed their topic work, where they looked at aspects of World War 1 and created some brilliant presentations that showed Banbury's involvement in the war. They also enjoyed completing some Design and Technology projects, where they made models of field guns. They children showed great maturity throughout the topic, both with the discussion of sensitive issues and the use of tools too. Well done Year 5!



We also enjoyed a wonderful visit to the Story Museum in Oxford where children immersed themselves in a magical world of different stories! Excitingly, this visit will contribute as evidence for the pupils Discover Arts Award submissions. Pupils will be working on their submission of evidenced for this award in Term 6.



Year 5 also joined Year 4 for their Disney Extravaganza Musical Performance. It was so lovely to see so many parents and family members supporting the event and the children sounded fantastic!

Literacy

We are beginning term 6 by focusing on our reading text, *The Highway Man*, which is a narrative poem. We will cover a range of curriculum areas through an in depth study of this poem and it will allow us to complete some performance poetry as well as link some art and music statements too. Later in the term, we will be writing persuasive texts which will encourage people to stay safe online. Finally, we will be looking at a quest story, 'The Enchanted Chest', before writing our own. Key features will include the development of carefully chosen vocabulary, a range of sentence structures as well the use of semicolons to link related sentences. To support your child at home, please ensure that they are completing **at least** 20 minutes of Lexia at home every week.

Maths

In term 6 we will be looking at angles within shapes and learning to measure accurately in degrees using a protractor. We will be using our knowledge of types of triangles and quadrilaterals to find missing angles within shapes. Moving on from this, we will be plotting points on a grid and translating their position and direction. After that, we will look at converting between units of measure e.g. 1000m = 1km and 1 year = 365 days. To finish off the year, we will be going back to place value, to ensure that we are able to work with numbers up to a million. To support your child at home, you can play the following games:

Physical Education

As the summer term continues, we will be practicing athletics on the field. This will include comparing our timings and striving to achieve our personal bests. Disciplines that we will be practicing are: long jump, speed bounce, long distance running, sprinting and vortex throw. PE sessions will continue to be on a Monday and Wednesday. Please ensure that your child has a PE kit in school every day. For your child's safety, earrings must be removed before any PE lesson and hair must be tied up. Please ensure that sun cream is applied to your child before coming to school on sunny days.

Science

In science lessons this term, the children will be learning about animals and plants, including humans. They will discuss the changes that happen to humans as they develop from birth into childhood and the differing stages of adulthood. In addition, the children will look at parts of plants and the reproductive function of each part of a flowering plant. We will be getting some hands-on experience by dissecting some flowering plants to have a good look!

Enterprise

In the first week of term 6, children will take part in an enterprise project where they will be creating an exciting product to market and sell. They will need to conduct research about how they can make their food ingredients more sustainable, taking many factors into consideration such as how they are sourced and the environmental impact they have. They will then have the option to buy products from across the school.

PSHE

Excitingly, Year 5 will be taking part in some Virtual Reality Road Safety sessions in Term 6. This will support their understanding of risk and hazard and of how to keep themselves as safe as possible which is particularly important as they head towards Year 6, secondary school and being more independent.

Transition Days

Children will spend the final 2 days of term (Thursday 21st - Friday 22nd July) with their new teachers in Year 6. These will be a fun-filled few days where the children and teachers will familiarize themselves with each other and begin to look at what will be covered over the next year. There will be numerous activities surrounding our conditions for learning, particularly belonging. During the transition days, your child will need to be dropped off in the morning and will need to be picked up every day from the year 6 classrooms - Oak and Chestnut.
