Driving Questions: If I were a ladybird, where would I want to live? *and* How can we, as Geographers investigate the differences between Banbury and London?

Literacy

Welcome to Year 2! This term our literacy will be focused on characterisation. We will be kicking off the school year by looking at 'The Bad-tempered Ladybird' by Eric Carle linked to our micro-habitats topic. We will be discussing the character and their actions as well as writing a sorry letter from the ladybird. This term our class text will be an instructions based text, where we will learn a set of instructions to take us to School View Park. We will be exploring the features of instructions and writing our own instructions of how to get to London for our trip. In addition we will be looking at the story 'Chalk' and discussing the character's feelings at different points in the story.

Ideas for at home: Practise your reading and phonics by playing online games on phonicsplay.co.uk, ictgames.co.uk or using the app Teach your monster to read.

Maths

This term we will be concentrating on consolidating our place value knowledge of numbers up to 100. By doing this, we will be using skills such as; reading and writing numbers, representing numbers, counting forwards and backwards as well as comparing numbers. All of these skills will give us the foundation for the rest of our maths learning in Year 2 as well as further up the school. In addition to this, we will begin to look at our fact families using our number bonds to 20 e.g. $14+3=17$, $17-3=14$, $3+14=17$, $17-14=3$

Ideas for at home: At home, you could practice counting forwards and backwards from any number, you could also try reading and writing numbers that you see over the holidays or around your home. PE

The children have two PE sessions a week. As PE days can change, to help us out please could the children's PE kits be in school all week. These are placed in boxes above their coat pegs. One session will be outside each week, so please ensure your child has black tracksuit trousers and a black plain jumper especially as the weather gets colder. We will inform you about the days they will be doing P.E when pupils return in term 1.

At home: PE kit should be a white t-shirt, black coloured shorts, black tracksuit trousers, black jumper and trainers or plimsolls. Make sure all their kit is labelled with clearly and is kept in a named bag in a box. Please also ensure jewellery is not worn with earrings removed. There will be a lost property basket in the cloakroom.

Creative Curriculum

Our focus this term will be linked to our topic questions, *If I were a ladybird, who would I live with?* and *How can we as Geographers investigate the differences between Banbury and London?* Our afternoons will primarily have a science and geography focus where we will look at different micro-habitats and the animals found there. We will then move on to thinking about Banbury where we live and comparing it to London, looking at similarities and differences between them and locating them on a map. We will also be having a focus on mental wellbeing and helping children describe their feelings and strategies to help them.

E – Safety

Our main focus in computer safety this term is about being safe online, ensuring the children are not talking to people they don't know online and what to do if someone tries to be their friend in a game. We will do work on this in school and discuss different scenarios with the children where they might face this. Please make sure you always monitor what your child is doing online.

Reminders and dates

Homework: We have sent out a homework project for the term due in September 16th. Please try and complete one or two of the activities on it. We will celebrate pupils homework and put it on display as part of a class museum. We will also be sending homework home via **Seesaw** (an online learning journal- a little like tapestry). You will be given more information about this at the start of term 1.

Trip: We will be aiming to go to Windsor Castle, more details will be given in Term 1 but we anticipate the cost will be between £15-£20.

How to get to the park
