Raise a Reader Campaign

We were so fortunate to take part in the raise a reader programme, linked to Oxford University Press. It is so important that children not only learn how to read, but learn how to become a reader. The raise a reader programme will support children at Dashwood to develop their love of reading and ultimately work towards creating a positive reading culture, that staff, pupils and parents all engage with. The project will really allow us to champion reading this year at Dashwood and will work in supporting our pupils become lifelong learners. We know that reading is key in all part of pupils' learning, and we hope that the support from Oxford University Press this year will really engage pupils to read.







We welcomed an author and illustrator...

As part of the Raise a Reader launch, we were lucky to have a visit from author Alex Falase-Koya and illustrator Paula Bowles. The pupils listened to the process of writing and illustrating the book and how they worked together to get it just right! The pupils asked thoughtful questions and enjoyed watching Paula create our very own Dashwood Superhero with her watermelon dress, armour and chocolate squirting backpack to help her scale buildings. Can you use your imagination to create your own story character?





Do you want some tips to support your child to read at home?

- •Remember, try to avoid a pressurised environment around reading. Reading should be enjoyable!
- ·Consider when and where you read together.
- •If it is the first time your child has read the book, look at the cover and title with them to predict what they think the book might be about.

- •Encourage children to track the words with their finger until they are able to read comfortably.
- ·Help the children to decode (read) the words and ask them about the meaning of more challenging words.
- ·Ask children about the content of what they have read who, what, where, when, why, how?
- ·Consider any key questions you can ask about what they have read (e.g, can they summarise to you, give their favourite part etc...)





Year 2 Tooth Defenders Day

Year 2 were sent on a special mission by the Tooth Defender team to raise awareness about how to look after our teeth.

The children learnt a story map about how to clean our teeth successfully; created their own toothbox to keep their teeth safe when they lose their baby teeth as well as creating their own experiment to see how different drinks affect their teeth. They will find out their results later on!!










Year 5: The Black Country Museum
