#### Dashwood are artists!





Lots of fantastic art has been going on at Dashwood this term! Children across the school have been using their new Art books fabulously, really displaying the breadth of knowledge and skills we try and develop here. The key facts about artists, which span many cultures and time periods, have been researched and the skills these famous artists use have been studied and practised. It is really pleasing to see children responding to the art they look at by giving their own justified opinions. Yr4 - 'I like that the sculpture is curved perfectly but I don't like that it is dull', YR1 -'I like the people and the darkness. I dislike the light in the ceiling' and Yr3 - 'My favourite art is the second one because it's peaceful and bright.' This is great to see as it links with our British Values of Individual liberty (having and expressing our own opinions) as well as Respect and Tolerance (for those who may think differently).





#### Whole School Art Day





The whole school took part in a leaf sketching day where the children revisited prior sketching skills and practised new techniques with graded pencils before sketching a variety of leaves. We were delighted with the careful observations skills, the clear shapes and outlines, the marking of the veins as well as some of the different sketching techniques involved. These included the scumbling, stippling, hatching and cross-hatching techniques. The display will look fabulous and will really showcase the progression of drawing skills across the entire school. We are very much looking forward to our second whole-school sketching event next term which will focus on historical artefacts. Watch this space for the whole school art display!





### **EYFS - Nursery**

This term Cherry class have been exploring new painting techniques such as using stencils and potato printing. They also had lots of fun making some delicious stained-glass window biscuits and colourful Christmas decorations.

Plum class have been focusing their learning around the story of Elmer. This included experimenting with mixing colours and learning about what makes them and their families unique.





### **EYFS - Reception**

Reception have had a busy term learning about the different people in our community who help us, alongside learning about how to keep ourselves healthy and safe. They took part in an informative mini medics workshop and learnt what to do in a medical emergency. They have also enjoyed lots of role play linked to doctors and vets.

In preparation for their nativity performance, Reception children visited Marlborough Road church to learn more about the Christmas story and also create their own christingles.









Year 1 have immersed themselves in all things Gruffalo this term. The children learnt the story through their literacy lessons by acting out the story map with actions to help them remember the story. The children then showed great bravery and confidence in their own performance of the Gruffalo. It was brilliant! To really celebrate this term's learning, pupils watched a fantastic performance of the Gruffalo at The Mill Arts Centre!

In addition to this, the children have been learning about the Great Fire of London, where they have had the opportunity to make their own bread inspired by real events. They thoroughly enjoyed making and decorating the bread.









Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about India this term and in particular the town of Chembakolli. Children investigated the different weather patterns between Chembakolli and Banbury, followed a school day of a child in Chembakolli and even got to taste some Indian food!

Moreover, some of the greatest achievements of our pupils this term has been through their artwork. We have practiced our sketching skills to help us sketch the Taj Mahal, as well as look at various Indian artwork such as Rangoli Art and Mehndi Patterns. The outcomes have been amazing!







Year 3 have been looking at Pop Art and Pointillism as their focus for this term.

They have considered the different techniques that were used by artists during this time period and then created their own Pointillism self portraits. They took their time and really focused on the details in the portrait to bring them to life.









Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about sculpture this term. They studied Barbara Hepworth and looked at the inspiration for her sculptures. They then moved onto the work of Giacometti and saw how his work portrayed people's emotions. Working in foil and then clay, they worked in groups in sculpt Giacometti 'style' people showing different emotions to tell a story.







Year 5 have produced some incredible outcomes this term (as we are sure you'll agree!). They have developed their stitching skills whilst making Victorian Christmas tree decorations. They had to carefully design their outcome, before choosing decorations to stitch on.



Pupils then had to combine all elements of their decoration and carefully fill it with stuffing. Children worked really hard to complete their decorations and really enjoyed the opportunity to develop a new skill too, whilst having a fantastic outcome to take home to share with their families.







Year 6 have enjoyed learning all about Leonardo Di Vinci, and studying his work. They took some time to carefully write a biography all about his works in science and art and then enjoyed focusing in on his more famous portraits (such as The Mona Lisa and The Last Supper) and carefully considered techniques that he used in his art work.

They linked this to their history learning this term and are on the way to producing some fantastic sketched portraits of Queen Mary I and Queen Elizabeth I, using sketching techniques that they have been practising.

On Thursday 10th November 2022, Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in the North Oxfordshire School Sports Partnership Hockey Competition at Wykham Park Academy. Competing against six other teams from local primary schools, our pupils played with resilience and skill, thoroughly enjoying the competition.

### Dashwood Action Committee

Thank you to all of the parents that attended our first meeting of the year where we discussed **homework** and **parental workshops**. We had a productive discussion about both of these and here are a summary of the key points discussed:

- Is there too much/too little homework? How do the children respond at home?
- Is the homework meaningful and related to classwork?
- How is homework rewarded and marked?
- How can we support parents to support their children at home in maths, literacy and spellings? Can videos be made?
- When is the best time to do the parent workshops? What workshops would be useful?

The student was fine but it is worth remaining vigilant and ensuring that our Dashwood children are always in the care of their parents or a trusted adult/family member when out and about.
