A note from the Principal...

What a great term we have had delving into the past! The pupils have certainly developed their enquiry skills and made links between periods of history they have already studied. When walking around school, I have seen some amazing learning outcomes including: Florence Nightingale lamps in DT, recreating Roman formations on the playground and using the chromatic scale to compose WW2 sirens.

This term we have focused on the characteristics of a hero and who we look up to and admire. We have looked at what makes a hero; it is not about always being the best at something but someone who may not give up when things are challenging or that they are always there with some good advice when you need it.

I challenge you to have a think over the half term holidays about who your hero is and why. How could you let them know that they are your hero?





EYFS - Nursery

Cherry class children have been focusing on developing their social skills and being heroes to each other in role play. They have begun to talk about their dreams and aspirations while making dream catchers.

Plum class children have been continuing their topic of people who help us. They have particularly enjoyed exploring the role of builders in the construction area. They have also spent time outside looking at seasonal changes and preparing the garden for spring.



EYFS - Reception



Last week, we became aerospace engineers and built rockets to help some stranded aliens get back home. We researched features of rockets and counted down to lift off when testing them.

We have been thinking about familiar heroes in our own lives and how we can show our appreciation to others. We have added wishes to our wishing tree and created a list of different words we can use to show others kindness.





Year 1 have had such an exciting term looking at everyday heroes such as fireman and nurses. We have even had the opportunity of meeting some Firemen and asking them questions about the important job they do.

We have been inspired when investigating Florence Nightingale as a significant figure. We have learnt about all the changes she made to hospitals and how poorly people are cared for. As our outcome, we made our own lamps just like Florence Nightingale.









Year 2: Space Centre

Wow!

What an incredible day Year 2 had at Space Centre this week.

When we arrived we had chance to watch a show in The Planetarium, which showed us all the dangers that astronauts faced and what it was like to be an astronaut floating in space.

In addition to this, we were able to climb a rocket tower to see a rocket up close; have a go at radio control and experience what it's like inside a rocket!









Year 2 have blown us away with their engagement and enthusiasm in our explorer topic this term. We have specifically focussed on missions completed by Neil Armstrong and Christopher Columbus.

Their enjoyment of this topic have been prevalent through the amazing writing outcomes they have created this term including Non - chronological reports, poetry and a diary entry.

In addition to this, they have also created their very own explorer vehicles.










Year 3 have been practising a few different notes and learnt a song on the recorder this term. They hope to be able to share with parents at the beginning of next term.

Year 4 have made some fantastic iMovies to explain the impact that Roman inventions had on the world today. This included looking at Roman underfloor heating, aqueducts and roads.












Children have shown great tolerance respect and maturity when looking at these issues. We hope they have come home and prompted conversations with you too! 





Year 6 celebration of writing!


Children then took part in a range of activities around the story such as face-painting, biscuit decorating, mask making and dancing.


World Book Day: Thursday 2nd March
