
them arow.

EYFS - Reception

We have spent the final couple of weeks of this term looking at the signs of spring and the changes happening in the environment around us.

In Reception we have also talked about the start of Ramadan, as well as Easter traditions, and pupils have shared some of their experiences of how their own families mark these events. We have also been busy exploring the changing state of chocolate by making our own delicious Easter eggs and following clues as part of an egg hunt.





Easter Hat Parades 2023

On the last day of term our EYFS children proudly showed us their creative Easter bonnets during our annual Dashwood Easter Hat Parade. There were some wonderful designs and and plenty of beaming smiles as the pupils walked around. Thank you to parents and carers who helped the children to make their hats at home.





Year 1 have been learning all about properties of materials to help answer our driving question 'What material is most suitable for a rain shelter? To do this, we had to investigate how waterproof a range of materials were.

In addition to this, we have also been using our maths skills to prove which object is longest.

Finally, we have applied our knowledge of victorian toys to create our own moving toy. We are then going to write up instructions to help other children make their own victorian toy.







In Year 2, we have been working really hard on our 'Pirates vs Mermaids' performance. The children have had to demonstrate great determination and bravery in learning their lines and remembering the songs. We hope you enjoyed their performance and are as proud of them as we are!

We have also been tremendous scientists this term, where we have been working towards two driving questions 'How can we as gardeners, ensure that sunflowers bloom?' and 'How can we prove that all creatures' needs are different?'. Each week, we have been monitoring our sunflowers growth and measuring how tall the stems have grown. In addition to this, we have produced factual and informative profiles on an endangered animal and offered suggestions of how we can save them.









Year 3 have thoroughly enjoyed making an Ancient Egyptian medicine. They have shown teamwork and a range of 21st century skills by working as part of a group to make the medicine for a particular ailment and then market it, producing eye-catching packaging to grab the attention of the customer. They have also created informative and persuasive leaflets for their medicine and presented all of this to the class.





Year 3 Recorders

Year 3 have been working really hard on their recorders. They 'wowed' their parents/carers with a fantastic performance. Let's see what they do later on in the year!






Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their chocolate topic this term. We have used our DT skills to design and name our own chocolate bars and have made these delicious treats, wrapped in our own designed packaging. The wrapped products look professional and we even wrote a persuasive advert to sell the bars. A fabulous trip to Cadburys World taught us more about the origins of chocolate as well as how it is made today. The children were wonderfully behaved and showed interest and engagement throughout the day. Year 4 enjoyed two science days where they found out about states of matter. After learning about solids, liquids and gases and how they can change state, the children worked cooperatively on a group project to display their understanding of why water is so amazing. We were delighted with the outcomes which displayed not only their skills in science but in art, literacy and computing too.





Year 5 have been learning about earthquakes and volcanoes. They have enjoyed exploring tectonic plates and understanding how earthquakes and volcanoes are formed. They have researched the impact of these devastating natural disasters. They have also made a fantastic iMovie explaining why some areas of the world have more volcanoes and earthquakes than others.






Year 6 are have enjoyed investigating which conditions mould grows best in. They have enjoyed monitoring the growth in different conditions and discussing the outcomes.

They have really enjoyed studying some Shakespeare and children have engaged with the story of Macbeth. It was great to see them act out parts of the play and they have worked hard to develop some descriptive writing based on the first scene of the play.

Finally, children showed excellent teamwork and sportsmanship in their year group family competitions - where they demonstrated their skills from PE this term in a match of basketball and a game of cricket!









Year 6 Science and Art visitors

Year 6 pupils have had a super term learning all about micro-organisms. They were very fortunate to have a visit from one of our parents who worked on a parasite called Schistosoma Mansoni, which is a worm that lives in the blood vessels around the intestine in humans and causes disease.

Pupils learnt about microscopy and the images it creates. They then had a amazing day working with teachers from Wykham Park Academy on creating their own micro-organism art. Pupils loved the individual and large-scale pieces that they created!

Student Leadership Training and updates

Many of our Pupil Leadership groups received training this term from our Aspirations Trust! All of the training was focused on the pupil as 'change-makers' who can use their voice and make a difference to causes and matters that they care about.

The Junior Leaders (Year 5) and Sports Leaders (Year 6) learned how to manage groups of younger pupils and engage them in physical activities which they will continue to plan and lead in lunchtimes, in PE lessons and in sporting events.

Our Aspiration Councillors spent their session looking through our recent Pupil Voice survey. They discussed two strengths from the survey and two areas they wanted to focus on to make improvements.

Our Eco-Warriors shared what they had been working on so far this year including litter-pick campaigns and raising awareness of caring for our environment - in school and out in the community.

Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors also shared their campaign to raise the awareness of what bullying is and isn't and how pupils can get support.





Whole School Science Fair

This year we have held a fantastic Science Fair with a competitive element to bring our science term to a celebratory finale. Each year group have busily worked on their science objectives, developing their knowledge of scientific concepts as well as their investigative skills. The children have worked cooperatively in groups and have been encouraged to use their flair and imagination to display their findings in an effective and engaging way. We have been delighted to see such a range of ways to demonstrate their understanding... computing using the chromebook presentation and word processing tools, art and design, graphs in maths as well as the use of diagrams and pictures. They look amazing and we couldn't wait to show them off in the hall.



The Oxford Literary Fair

On the 28th February some of our pupils from Year 6 attended a very special author event in Oxford as part of the **Oxford Literary Festival**.

Children sat through a special talk by the author Joseph Coelho, where he told them all about his work and writing processes. He discussed 'The Power of Poetry' and, as the new children's laureate, the discussion was very powerful.

After the talk children had the chance to meet the author too and take part in a book signing.

Ties are available to buy from the school office. Please come in and purchase one if needed.








P.E Uniform
