A royal reading encounter....

On Thursday 18th May, 2 pupils from Year 6 had the opportunity to go and take part in a 'dream library' workshop, working alongside top children's authors, Malorie Blackman and Cressida Cowell. Not only did they get to talk to the authors and discuss their ideas all around reading for pleasure, they were visited by a very special VIP guest... Her Majesty, Queen Camilla! EYFS - Nursery





Cherry class have continued with their minibeast topic and learning about different insects. They have created some lovely salt dough honeycomb pieces and bees, as well as using marbling and printing techniques to create some spider webs like in their class story, 'The Very Busy Spider'.

Plum pupils have been enjoying the warmer weather and spending lots of time outside. They have been mixing up natural ingredients in the mud kitchen, hunting for bugs in their bug hotel and experimenting in the water tray. They have also been working collaboratively each week on a big art project linked to their class story, creating different characters from 'Sharing a Shell' using a variety of resources and techniques.





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EYFS - Reception

Reception classes continued their pirate topic and had fun innovating their class story. They practised a range of skills while designing, making, and testing out boats they made using junk modelling. The majority of which successfully floated on water! While learning about the oceans, the pupils showed lots of interest in finding out more about the impact of plastic waste on the environment. They then went on to design posters to inform people of how they can look after the world around them. They have now pledged to try to reduce waste paper and put the correct waste in the recycling bins. The final week of term saw Reception focusing on leading healthy lifestyles, such as eating a balanced

diet, getting enough sleep, good hygiene practises and the importance of mental well-being.








Year 1 have had an exciting end to their Little Red Riding Hood topic. They have written their own versions of the story and created some fact files about wolves. They even used their reading skills to find the facts and information that they wanted to include.

Additionally, we have been thinking about how we can improve the school environment. As a result the children have made posters about picking up litter, to put up in school, as well as some butterfly feeders to go in the wildlife area and for our own gardens.

This week, the children have been learning about computer programming and have been giving characters instructions using the Scratch junior app so that they can move in different ways across the screen. It was lovely seeing how absorbed they were trying to make their characters move and checking whether they had the correct instructions or not.





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Firstly, we would like to say a massive well done to all of the Year 2 children for showing such resilience and determination during their end of Key Stage assessments last week. Everyone tried their very best and we couldn't be prouder of them. We celebrated all their hard work at the end of the week with a special treat and reward.

In addition to this, Year 2 have shown off their creative flair through designing several types of puppet. They have had to learn the skill of stitching and practicing the running stitch with their hand puppets. Alongside this, they also had the opportunity to create either a finger, spoon, sock or lollipop puppet to perform in a puppet performance. Their designs and performances were incredible.







Year 3 have had an exciting few weeks learning about rivers and canals. They have learnt about water pollution and then created their own water filters in forest school. They have been on a walk along Banbury canal and were lucky enough to see canal boat going through the locks too! They have used this knowledge to design and create their own sustainable and safe bridge using tinkercad, a great computing resource and then recycled materials.

Im literacy, we have been looking at a poem called 'The Sound Collector' and then the children created their own fantastic poem, thinking carefully about the sounds they would 'collect'.





A visit from an architect...

Year 3 had a fascinating visit from Lynn Palmer, who is an architect, at the start of their DT project to design and build a bridge over a canal. She explained what architects do and how she designs houses. She then showed them some amazing bridges from around the world and discussed the things that designers would need to consider when designing a bridge.







Year 4 have been learning the skills and rules required for a successful game of handball. The children are really enjoying our weekly games and are developing skills in a range of passes as well as finding an effective space and intercepting the ball. The game is fast paced and fun and we have been really impressed with the teamwork shown.

Year 4 have also continued to practise daily for our Musical Extravaganza and what a fabulous show it was!



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What an exciting term year 5 have had. They have really enjoyed making their wheeled field guns in DT for their WW1 topic.

They have been rehearsing for their Musical Extravaganza every day, and Wow what a show!

Ties are available to buy from the school office. Please come in and purchase one if needed.








P.E Uniform
