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EYFS - Nursery

Cherry class have been growing their own produce this term, including tomatoes, courgettes, peppers and strawberries. They have also been comparing the height of their sunflowers to themselves and learning about what plants need to grow.

This term, **Plum class** have been continuing with the story *The Hungry Caterpillar* and discussing healthy and unhealthy food choices. They have also enjoyed measuring out special ingredients to mix up some magical potions.



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EYFS - Reception

What a wonderful end to the year we have had in Reception. The children have blown us away by the progress they have made this year. Learning to read and write is an incredible accomplishment! To celebrate their achievements we have held a teddy bears picnic during forest school; a water and splash party as a class reward, and a graduation ceremony to mark the end of the Early Years Foundation Stage. The pupils are more than ready for their next milestone of moving into key stage 1.



Cotswold Animal Park

Reception classes enjoyed their first big trip out of school to Cotswold Wildlife Park this term.

They were very excited to travel on a coach/minibus and even more excited to meet the different animals. When asked, their favourites included, the penguins, meerkats and lions.

Year 1

Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed their last term in Year 1 with some fabulous outcomes. We kicked off the term with a glorious dress up day, where every child looked like Royalty. This enthusiasm only continued with our castle topic this term.

In Literacy, we have been exploring the story Jack and the beanstalk. We have discussed how brave Jack had to be to defeat the giant as well as creating our own version of the story.



Broughton Castle Trip

Both Year 1 classes had a wonderful time on their Broughton Castle Trip. It was amazing to bring our topic of Castles to life where we identified features of a castle that we had discussed in class. We really enjoyed being able to experience what it would be like to live in a castle too!



Year 2

Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed their final term in Key Stage 1. In Literacy, we showcased our performance skills by performing our own retelling of a poem 'pirate fred'. We also have had chance to demonstrate all the writing skills we have learnt throughout the year to produce a lost and found story.

In the afternoons, we began the term by comparing life at Dashwood in the victorian times to life at Dashwood now. Then we drew on our knowledge from the beginning of the year about seas and the UK to help us locate Bournemouth. We have investigated the human and physical features of both Banbury and Bournemouth. We used this to then discuss where we would prefer to live and why.

A final highlight had to be creating our own clay leaves as part of the History of Dashwood art week, which are now proudly on display down Learning Lane!



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Year 3

Our enterprise event went really well and everyone enjoyed playing the magnetic games especially the hook a duck, car racers, magnetic monopoly and fishing. The children showed collaboration and demonstrated their entrepreneurial skills.

We have also been looking at how to keep healthy by creating a healthy living booklet and making healthy pizzas.



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Year 4

We thoroughly enjoyed our Y4 camp night earlier this term - an incredibly memorable event. The children participated in team games and fun activities, really getting stuck into all the challenges admirably. Not much sleep was had by many children but it was all part of the camping experience!



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Year 5

Year 5 have been lucky enough to be invited to Wykham Park to take part in a science lesson. They learnt about the factors needed for combustion and then experimented to find which materials made the best fuel.




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New and Different meetings

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Summer has arrived...take care in the sun with these helpful NHS tips

Sun safety tips

Spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm from March to October.

Make sure you:

- spend time in the shade between 11am and 3pm
- never burn
- cover up with suitable clothing and sunglasses
- take extra care with children
- use at least factor 30 sunscreen

What factor sunscreen (SPF) should I use?

Do not rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun. Wear suitable clothing and spend time in the shade when the sun's at its hottest.

When buying sunscreen, the label should have:

- a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30 to protect against UVB
- at least 4-star UVA protection

UVA protection can also be indicated by the letters "UVA" in a circle, which indicates that it meets the EU standard.

From Saturday 8 July, children can sign up to the challenge for free at their nearest [Oxfordshire Library](#). They will be given a Ready, Set, Read! folder to keep track of their reading.

As children read brilliant library books, they will receive stickers and other special incentives. Add the stickers to the collector's folder to discover how the Ready, Set, Read! friends work together and use their skills to complete a fictional obstacle course.

When children complete the challenge, they win a certificate and medal.





