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Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to wish you a very warm welcome back to a new school year. We are excited to welcome back existing pupils and families as well as new. I hope that you have had a lovely summer break; the staff have been in preparing for your return and we are looking forward to another great year at Dashwood, full of trips and events both at school and within the community.

It is important to inform you that Dashwood has undergone the relevant RAAC (Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete) survey, in line with government guidance, and no evidence has been observed and pupils will return as normal tomorrow. Children in Cherry, Plum, Peach and Pear have their own start dates.

Our priority is to ensure that the pupils feel happy and safe at school. We will therefore be focusing on fostering their sense of self-worth, one of our three guiding principles, by ensuring they all feel valued and respected in their classes. We will also be supporting the development of positive relationships with peers as well as with their teacher and teaching assistants so that all of our pupils feel they have a trusted adult to talk to if they ever need to. We are really looking forward to our Cultural Day on Friday 29th September where all the pupils are invited to dress in clothes that represent them as individuals: their culture, relation and heritage. We discuss our similarities and differences as well as celebrate our diverse Dashwood Community. It is certainly one of the highlights of our calendar!


