
Just a reminder that doors open at 8.45am and the gates will be locked at 8.52am. This is because we need to register the children and get them ready to start their learning at 9am.

# CLEAR VISION UNDERPINNED BY A SET OF STRONG GUIDING PRINCIPLES



### Behaviour Policy


Regulated state of alertness, shows control: ready to learn and/or be social.

Heightened state of alertness but with some control including stress, anxiety, excitement, silliness, nervousness and confusion.

Hyperactive

Low states of alertness including sluggish. The brain is moving slowly.

'Zoned out'



All the pupils have taken part in lessons where we have taught them about different emotions and strategies to help us when we are finding things tricky. The important thing to remind children is that it is ok to be in any of these zones but it is never ok to hurt someone or be unkind. Heightened state of alertness but with very intense emotions including rage, explosive, terror, panic. There is no control over emotions here. No ability to think, be rational, negotiate or reflect.


#### New this year....

This year we have introduced the STOP strategy.

S.T.O.P.

a powerful, yet surprisingly basic strategy that helps you to be focused, alert, relaxed, and at your emotional best when a big moment presents itself in your life.

A four-step mental checklist to use anytime you want to add a burst of fresh energy, creativity, or insight to whatever is going on. The whole idea behind it is that by taking a very brief break—even less than one minute—you can determine the very best action to take in the moment.



#### EYFS - Nursery

Both Cherry class and Plum class have been busy helping new children to settle in and getting to know the new families who have joined our Dashwood community.

The pupils have been meeting new classmates and learning about how we can be a good friend to others. They have enjoyed exploring their classrooms and outside space, while playing with all of the different resources available.

We know it can be daunting starting nursery for the first time or coming back after the summer break, but the children have all settled really well and quickly becoming familiar with the new routines. A great start to the year!





### EYFS - Reception

Our Reception children have had a great first week at school.

They have spent time getting to know each other and the staff, as well as exploring the environment.

They have quickly becoming familiar with class routines, such as lunch times and carpet sessions, as well as taking part in listening and attention activities.

The pupils have been supported to develop their independence by putting their belongings away and tidying up their areas at the end of each session. We are very proud of how well they have settled into school.









Year 1 have made such a fantastic transition into Key Stage 1. They have been working hard to learn our new routines and gain dojo's for all of their hard work.

In Literacy, they started off by looking at Beegu. We discussed how we would feel if we found ourselves in a strange place and how we could solve problems. In maths, we have been sorting objects and counting to 10 as well as representing those numbers.






Year 2 have made a great start to the year, they have worked hard developing their knowledge about zones of regulation and following our school rules.

They have loved investigating which minibeasts they could find around the school grounds - they even found a frog!

The pupils have been really engaged reading the story of the Bad Tempered Ladybird and Zog and have produced some lovely letters pretending to be the ladybird. Well done for a great start!







Year 3 has had a really exciting and engaging start to the year. Last week, we visited the Natural History Museum in Oxford to learn about dinosaurs and fossils. After our engaging teaching session where we got to look at a huge T Rex fossilised jaw as well as fossilised dinosaur poo, we explored the museum to look at dinosaur skeletons and skeletons of creatures still alive today like an elephant.

In class, we have been learning about what a human skeleton looks like and why we need one. The children now know that it keeps us upright and protects our vital organs, including the brain, heart and lungs. What a great start to our time in Year 3!







Year 4 have had a fantastic first couple of weeks back at school! We've been busy settling into our new classes and routines and completing lots of work around our school rules of Ready, Respectful and Safe.

Also, we've began to look at a new story called On Sudden Hill and we will be creating instructions of how to make a robot linked to this over the next few lessons.

In Maths, we've been consolidating our knowledge of place value and applying it to numbers up to a thousand.

Finally, we kick started our new project based around Destination Europe, where we had the opportunity to research countries in Europe and key facts about these countries.









We have really enjoyed our first couple of weeks in Year 5! The children have been really enthusiastic about our geography topic of South America and enjoyed locating the countries. In maths, our focus has been place value and we have been really impressed with how many children really challenge themselves to dive deeper into their learning.



Literacy the last couple of weeks has been focused around the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker. It has been really interesting exploring this wordless picture book and the children have shared some insightful opinions. An amazing start to the year ahead, well done Year 5!




