Starting School

- Your child will need uniform and a PE kit— please see your parents handbook.
- They will take part in **Forest School** weekly so a pair of wellies, waterproofs and old clothes will be useful.
- Please send them in with a named water bottle (only water in these please for oral hygiene)
- We provide milk and fruit for snack time.
- Please ensure your child has some form of book bag
- Children will receive homework and reading books.
- Name everything! EVERYTHING!!!
- No toys or jewellery please.
- Coats, hats, sun cream daily or when needed.



The School Day

- Drop off at 8:45am at the classroom doors
- Pick up at 3:10-3:15pm at the classroom doors.
- Four class carpet sessions a day
- Discovery time, adult led smaller guided groups and targeted interventions throughout the day too.
- Lunch in the hall school dinners are free but need to be booked in advance on 'Parent Pay'. Can bring a healthy packed lunch as an alternative (not both please).



Keeping your child safe

- Lots of hand washing
- Locked gates and a one way system in school
- Regular lessons on wellbeing and safety (including internet safety)
- Mental health curriculum as well as physical safety
- Risk assessments in place
- Regular fire alarm and lockdown practises
- Password system for collection
- Please ensure your details are up to date
- Medication and allergies
- The children are our <u>number one priority</u> to keep healthy and safe at all times





Settling in

- You will drop your child off at their new classrooms, staff will help to settle them into an activity.
- Pupils will start the year getting to know each other and the routines.
- They will become familiar with school rules and expectations.
- We are encouraging the children to be more independent with their belongings at drop off and home time.
- Sharing on Tapestry both from school and home.
- At home time children will need to wait to be called and we cannot allow parents/carers inside until all pupils have left.

Attendance

- We aim for 96% or above
- Below 90% = Persistent absentee
- No holidays during term time this is the law
- If ill = call school before 8.30am
- If they have a mild cold = normally send them in and we will keep an eye on them. If Covid-19 symptoms, take a test.
- Sickness/diarrhoea = 48 hour policy



Our Environment

- We have two Reception classrooms that are joined together and children are free to explore **both**.
- Different areas to promote and practise a range of skills, encourage conversation and creativity.
- Staff provide enhancements to these areas linked to a topic or children's interests.
- Access to outside daily, in all weathers.
- Children will be given a tidy up area and put into a Key Family to help them show a sense of belonging and leadership.





Behaviour

- Whole school rules;
 Ready, Respectful and Safe.
- Use the **Zones of Regulation** so pupils can reflect on their emotions, feelings and behaviour.
- Thinking zones are used to help support pupils to regulate themselves.
- Children will be given a tidy up area and put into a Key Family to help them show a sense of belonging and leadership.
- Pupils learn that there a positive and negative consequences for all behaviour.
- Dojo points, 'Star of the Day' and class rewards.





Curriculum and Schemes

- Follow the children's interests and also plan in short and longer topics to introduce new learning.
- Every topic starts with a WOW and ends with a Reflection
- White Rose Maths and Mastering Number schemes
- Read, Write Inc phonics scheme
- Talk4Writing literacy scheme using model texts to learn and adapt
- Real life experiences
- Funky Finger Friday!

End of Year Expectation

- Pupils aim to achieve the Early Learning Goals
- Areas of learning:
- Communication and Language
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- **Physical Development** (gross and fine motor skills)
- Literacy (read and write simple sentences, retell stories)
- Mathematics (recall number bonds to 10)
- Understanding the World (foundations of science, geography, RE, history, ICT)
- Expressive Art and Design (creativity, imagination, role-play, singing, music)
- The children will graduate at the end of the year!






Tapestry

Top Tips

- Try on uniform and particularly encourage children to practise taking off their cardigans/jumpers.
- Show children what their belongings look like.
- Practise the journey to school and talk through first day expectations.
- Become confident to use the toilet on their own
- Use a knife and fork independently
- Practise getting completely changed for PE
- Wear school shoes around the house
- Practise holding a pencil with a tripod grip
- Children could practise writing their name
