Literacy

During this term we will be learning our version of the story 'The Gruffalo' in Literacy. We will be learning this story orally and then working on re-writing a new version to practise our skills in order to make sure the stories we write have a clear beginning, middle and end. We will be continuing to focus on using punctuation, such as full stops and capital letters in the correct places when writing and making sure our handwriting is neat.

Maths

In maths this term, we will have a focus on number. We will learn how to add and subtract within 10. We will also be learning about 2D and 3D shapes, as well as patterns and sorting shapes.

At home: please can your practise reciting the number bonds to 10 with your child, they could do this by saying them aloud, writing them down, making posters to represent the different ways of showing the number bond. If your child is secure with their number bonds to 10, please focus on number bonds to 20. Number bonds to 10 include: 1+9, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6, 5+5 and 10+0.
