How can we explain how emotions are portrayed through sculpture?

Term 2 October - December 2023

Literacy

We are beginning this term by looking at Haiku poetry. The children will be using their imagination to create an interesting poem based on the seasons. This website can help you to begin to understand what Haiku poetry is and what the features of this type of writing are:

Later in the term we will be focusing on the Anthony Browne story, *Voices in the Park*. This picture book allows us to use our inferencing skills to understand how the characters are feeling.

Maths

This term, we will focus on addition and subtraction and multiplication and division.

In addition and subtraction, we will be adding numbers with 4 digits and considering whether we will need to exchange. We will also be focusing on the most efficient methods to add up 2 single digit numbers to support this. In multiplication and division this term we will learn to multiply and divide by 10, 100, 1 and 0. We will also be looking at the 3, 6, 9 and 7 times table in depth. Here we will aim to have instant recall of both the multiplication and division facts. This will then enable us to go on to learn how to multiply 3 digits by 1 digit (243 x 7) after Christmas.

Physical Education

In netball, we will be developing our communication skills and tactics as well as focusing on our dance unit 'Wild Animals.' Art

Art is our main topic this term. We will be studying the life of Barbara Hepworth who was a world renowned sculptor. We will then go on to consider how sculptors such as Giacometti used their work to show people's feelings and emotions before making our own sculptures from tin foil and clay. As a group we will be making sculptures that show a range of emotions and explaining how we might be affected by that emotion and how we can support others when they are feeling that way. This links to the PSHE we will be looking at this term.
