Drawing the Past

Driving Question: How can we, as historians, prove whether Mary I or Elizabeth I had a more successful reign? Driving Question: Can you prove that the impact of the work of Di Vinci impact on our lives today? Main Subjects: Art and Design, History

This term our focus subjects are art and design; and history. We will be learning about the life of Leonardo Di Vinci and then using his techniques to create our own observational drawings. We will also be studying, through our 'Kings and Queens' topic, the lives and reigns of Queen Elizabeth I and Mary I (Bloody Mary). We will be comparing these two historical figures and their ruling. We will then combine our art work with the history focus and complete portraits of both queens.

Literacy

This term we will be looking at a discussion text, 'Should Daleks Be Allowed To Live On Earth?" and will use the features within this text to write our own discussion texts as we look at Queen Elizabeth and Mary I and which had the most successful reign.

At home you could: read every day for at least 15 minutes and aim to use the Lexia app for at least 15 minutes a day. Practise your handwriting while you are learning your weekly spellings. If you come across a new word in your reading books, magpie it! This means you look up the meaning in a dictionary, write it down and start to use it in your own writing.

Please ensure your child is completing every piece of homework to the highest standard which includes good spelling, handwriting and punctuation. This really supports their transition to secondary school so that pupils understand the expectation of home learning and the importance of completing this. Maths

We spent lots of time last term cementing our knowlegde in addition, subtraction , multiplication and division. We will apply this understanding to fractions, decimals and percentages, which will be a focus this term. We will then move on to looking at position and direction.

Physical Education

Science

In science we will be exploring light; collecting and identifying evidence that supports or refutes an idea. This will involve setting up and conducting fair tests and then talking about what our results tell us.

Our text the pupils will learn: Should Daleks be allowed to live on Earth?
