A BIG thank to all of our Dashwood Families for your support.








EYFS - Nursery

Cherry class have been continuing with their topic of weather. Alongside this they have been practising to develop their fine motor skills using scissors. They are going to be using these new skills to create some festive snowflakes.

Plum class have been continuing their work on celebrations and festivals. They have decorated diyas for Diwali and learned about the significance of poppies on Remembrance Day. During Forest School sessions, pupils have been using natural items to create the initial letter of their name.





EYFS - Reception

Peach and Pear pupils have enjoyed role-playing doctors and vets recently. They have been demonstrating their caring nature and also practising literacy skills by writing down appointments and prescriptions.

Reception classes also had an informative and practical mini medics session, learning about what to do in an emergency and also how to keep themselves safe to prevent accidents. The children particularly liked putting bandages on their injured teddy bears and calling for help as loudly as they could!






Year 1 have achieved so many wonderful things so far this term.


This week we have ended our Great Fire of London topic with the opportunity of making our own bread like in the bakery of Pudding lane. They looked and tasted really scrummy.

In maths, we have been working really hard to write number sentences to 10. As well as talking about doubles and pairs.

In literacy, we have completed some amazing writing using the Gruffalo text as a hook and changing it to our own journey story, using our phonics knowledge, capital letters and full stops.







Year 2's driving question this term has been: How would my life be similar or different if I were to grow up in Chembakolli? They have loved learning about the similarities and differences our cultures and tradition are. This week they have tried some indian food.





Year 3 has been working so hard this term in their Literacy lessons. They became ambassadors of change for Dashwood school and have worked hard to persuade Mrs Gordon-Weeks to revamp the lunchtime activity rota, making it fun and exciting as well as developing skills and friendships even further. The children took their original ideas and developed them into clear, concise paragraphs and used formal, persuasive language to write their effective speeches. After a discussion about presentation skills, the children practised their speeches and a few children presented to Mrs Gordon-Weeks. They were a little nervous (which is normal) but did a brilliant job. We were delighted to receive an email this week congratulating the children on their fantastic vocabulary and presentations. The children are now very much looking forward to all the exciting opportunities for lunchtimes which will cater to many skills and interests. Well done Year 3 - we are very proud of you.

Year 4 have been showing their creative flare over the past few weeks. In our art sessions, we have focused on sculpture through researching and comparing the work of Barbara Hepworth and Alberto Giacometti. We have then created our own sculptures through exploring the themes in their work. Year 4 were very excited to use different mediums including soap, foil and clay, to create unique sculptures based upon emotions. We are looking forward to exploring our computing skills to create an IMovie to present our outcomes.











We have had an exciting couple of weeks in year 5. Sycamore class have now nearly finished sewing their Christmas decorations and Beech class are looking forward to starting theirs next week. In maths, we have been developing our understanding of multiplication and division. We have learnt about prime, square and cube numbers, as well as exploring how multiplication and division are linked. The children have been really impressing the adults by using a lot of new mathematical vocabulary in their written explanations. In literacy, we have just finished writing poetry, which are being put into a class book for us to share, and we are moving on to looking at the book 'The Polar Express'. We have enjoyed reading the story and inferring character. The children are very engaged in our history topic of the Victorians. We have been learning about the lives of children, which included lots of surprising facts, and we really loved our trip to the Black Country Living Museum.








Year 6 have had an amazing time learning all about light and experimenting with shadows in science. We planned and carried out our own experiments to test how shadows change depending on an object's distance from a light source. We then plotted our results on to line graphs and drew conclusions from our findings. In history, we have been comparing the reigns of Elizabeth I and Mary I. We have considered what they each achieved in their reigns and have written our own discussion texts to decide on who we felt was the more successful Tudor monarch. We are now moving on to our art unit to finish out the term and have begun learning all about the life of Leonardo da Vinci and his famous works.

Arbor Update

As you will be aware, we have transitioned over to use Arbor to store all of your child's information, attendance records and medical needs. This system will enable parents/carers to log into an account and view all the information that the schools holds on your child/ren and also enables you to update information as necessary when things change.

Once set up, this will also be the place that you can book activity clubs, parent evening sessions. You will also use the portal for booking meals, breakfast and after school club, giving consent for trips and making payments for these items.

Just so you know our timeline for rolling out the full system for you to access (please note that these are approximate timings):

- January 2024 use the parent portal for communication. Emails will be sent instead of texts. (texts will only be used to inform parents/carers if we are late back from a trip etc)
- February 2024- Parents and Carers will be able to book activity clubs and Parents evenings
- April 2024 Parents and Carers can book school meals and make payments for all trips and events.





We are changing our catering supplier
