This term has flown by and cannot believe that we are at the end of term 3 already. This term we have introduced a new work share celebration on a Friday whereby children are chosen from each class to come and share their learning, something they have improved on or that they just consistently produce fantastic learning week on week. Miss Gooch and I sit with them and look through their learning and they explain what they have been learning and tell us why they think they have been chosen. The quality of some of the learning has been amazing; improved presentation, quantity of work produced and the quality of the responses they are giving to their phased learning. Lots of children were achieving the 'deeper learning' tasks where they were really challenged- they appeared to love getting onto this phase.

I would like to just raise the importance of pupils attending school every day unless they are really unwell. They generally perk up throughout the day and we would always contact you if they were not fit for school. Missing school has a huge impact on not only their academic achievement but also their confidence. I have included our attendance newsletter for term 3 for you to read on the next page.

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Attendance

Attendance Newsletter Term 3

Welcome back to school in 2024! We were really pleased to see the children attending on time and wearing correct uniform on the first day of term.

The new year is a great opportunity to remind pupils that they can have 100% attendance from this point on, every term is a new start. The link between attendance and attainment is clear:

In 2018/19, just 40% of persistently absent children in Key stage 2 achieved expected key stage 2 standards, compared with 84% of pupils who were regular attenders.

The UK Government is encouraging school attendance with their new campaign 'moments matter, attendance counts'. You have hopefully seen the posters for this around the school. The aim of this campaign is to try and prevent avoidable absences - for minor illnesses or minor worries.





Attendance letters

In term 2 we sent attendance letters to parents/carers whose child had less than 90% attendance and found that attendance improved following this. We will be sending these letters again, to inform parents if their child's attendance has dropped below 90%.

If your child's attendance has dropped below 80%, you will be invited in for an attendance meeting so that we can support you and your child. If you are worried about your child's attendance, please feel free to come and speak to a member of the leadership team for support at any time.

Holidays

We would like to remind you about the Holiday Warning letter that we sent on 5th September 2023, which is available on our website in the 'letters to parents' section.

Any application for a planned term-time absence must be made in writing to the Principal, Sarah Gordon-Weeks. We **do not** authorise any time off for term-time holidays and any families taking term-time holidays will be referred to Oxfordshire County Council for a penalty notice. We find that this practice ensures fairness for all. Please see our whole school letter for more information <u>here</u>.



If your child is unable to attend, it is very important that you contact the school by 09.00. If a child is absent without contact being made, the office staff will contact you to find out the reason for absence. If we cannot contact the main parents/carers, we will contact everyone on the contact list. In the unusual event that we cannot make contact with anyone, we may conduct a home visit to make sure everything is ok.

We are here to help!

Sometimes children have worries about coming to school, some families may find it difficult to find transport or physically get their child to school. 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Nursery

weather.



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


Reception


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EYFS Bedtime Story Event

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Reception Parent Maths Workshop



Year 1 have absolutely loved our topic of people who help us this term. Especially, learning about FLorence Nightingale. To celebrate this, we all made an artefact (her lamp) to be used in a museum and help other understand why she was so important. The children worked really hard on their lamps showing creativity, resilience and determination. In addition to this, Year 1 have also been learning about height and length this week and have been enjoying measuring things in the classroom.







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After an exciting visit to Space centre, Year 2 have produced some fantastic outcomes in all areas of their learning. They have been able to create rockets from junk modelling showing creativity, collaboration and determination. They then gave each other positive feedback on how to improve their rocket. In addition to this, they have also written some amazing poems about space using rhyming words.

Year 2, are now looking forward to practicing for their production next term!









Year 3 have been busy this term being curious historians and finding out about The Stone Age. Their key question has helped them research and learn from archeologists and what evidence has been found at key excavation sites. They have enjoyed an interactive tour of Skara Brae and collected evidence to help them plan and create their very own Stone Age settlement. Working in teams, pupils have had to discuss and create team rules, plan roles and then use their creative clay skills to work collaboratively. They have overcome challenges and reflected on their teamwork, which has been a brilliant experience. Well done Year 31












Year 4 have had an amazing term! Building on the exciting start to our Roman topic, we have explored deeper to understand the daily lives of Roman citizens and soldiers. Using this knowledge, we have critically evaluated how the Roman Empire expanded and how the affected the rest of the world, most notably Britain. This inspired our outcome in Literacy, which was a newspaper article which reported upon the conflict between the Romans and Boudicca the British Leader.







Year 5 have had a fantastic time learning about the Vikings this term. They have been focussing on the difference between Vikings and Saxons and learning about famous Viking kings. They have also enjoyed reading the book 'The Last Viking' by Terry Deary.

In maths, they have continued working hard on fractions including learning how to order fractions accurately.

Finally, a massive congratulations to Sycamore class who won the TTRS competition on Friday with the highest average score!








Year 6 have continued to delve deeper into their WWII unit and have been looking at interesting topics such as the use propaganda, the Blitz, evacuation and Hitler Youth. They have also been putting themselves in the shoes of children during the war to write impactful setting descriptions using emotive language and creating TASC wheel projects to answer our driving question - How can we document what life was like for children in WWII?

During maths, they have been working on understanding ratio and scaling and using this knowledge to solve problems.





Year 5 & 6 Girls' Football

A huge congratulations to our Y5+6 girls football team who attended an event at Wykham Park to compete against other local schools. They played incredibly well as a team and finished joint first whilst not conceding a single goal!

The intent of this event was to develop sport specific skills and the progress that the children made was really evident across the morning. The focus school games value was RESPECT. The children really took this on board, demonstrating excellent behaviour and manners, it was especially lovely to see the children enjoying running under the respect tunnels at the end of the matches.

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Arbor Update

As you will be aware, we have transitioned over to use Arbor to store all of your child's information, attendance records and medical needs. This system will enable parents/carers to log into an account and view all the information that the schools holds on your child/ren and also enables you to update information as necessary when things change.

Once set up, this will also be the place that you can book activity clubs, parent evening sessions. You will also use the portal for booking meals, breakfast and after school club, giving consent for trips and making payments for these items.

Just so you know our timeline for rolling out the full system for you to access (please note that these are approximate timings):

- January/Feb 2024 use the parent portal for communication. Emails will be sent instead of texts. (texts will only be used to inform parents/carers if we are late back from a trip etc)
- February 2024- Parents and Carers will be able to book activity clubs and Parents evenings
- April 2024 Parents and Carers can book school meals and make payments for all trips and events.





Dashwood Action Committee

The Dashwood Action Committee is a group of parent/carers and Dashwood staff representatives who meet to discuss issues and suggest how we can make positive change.

As a result of the group, we have run a behaviour workshop for parents; added slips in the office to request food items; revamped the boat and developed our internet safety page on the website.

In the last meeting we talked about how we teach maths in school, especially our early maths. With this in mind, we will be running two maths sessions, one for EYFS and one for KS1 in the first instance.


