Exploring Africa

Our topic this term is all about Africa and we will be learning the story of 'Handa's Surprise'.


Driving Question this term: How can we compare our local area and lifestyle to that of a child in rural Kenya?


Focus Questions for this term:


- Week 1 How can I use my knowledge of the story to summarise?
- Week 2 What are the similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries?
- Week 3 What descriptive language can I use to explain what the animals look like?
- Week 4 When I listen and move to music how does it make me feel?
- Week 5 Why is it important to follow instructions when cooking?
- Week 6 Can I create a pattern?

Maths

This term we will be continuing to use ten frames and the part-whole model to support the children with their number bonds to 10. These are useful to represent the different parts which combine to make the whole. Children will be encouraged to record their work using mathematical jottings.

Expressive Arts and Design

This term we will be re-telling our class story and creating an African inspired performance piece. We will be making African animal masks and exploring African traditions, dances and music. We will be using our creative skills to explore different art techniques, tools and materials in our colourful designs and patterns.

Physical Development

This term we will be focusing on how we create dances to different styles of music, thinking about how we move our bodies to different beats and rhythms. We will also be using the story of Handa's Surprise to represent the different movements for the wonderful animals that she encounters.

In addition, we will be looking at the effect exercise has on our bodies and different ways we can keep our bodies fit and healthy. We will also have a focus on using tools such as cutlery, to support fine motor skills. It would be great if the children could practise using cutlery at home too.

Understanding the World

This term we are going to be finding out information about Africa. We will be looking specifically at the lifestyles of people who live in Kenya, including daily routines, clothes, homes, families, the environment and climate. We will then be comparing some aspects of Kenya to Banbury to celebrate the differences and similarities. Alongside our topic of Africa, we will also discuss the start of Ramadan, the celebration of Easter and signs in our garden that show Spring is on its way.



Communication and Language, Reading and Writing

In our literacy lessons we will be learning a version of Handa's Surprise (see below). We will be exploring the characters in the story as well as looking at its structure (beginning, middle and end). We will be looking at the language that is used especially the adjectives used to describe the animals and fruit. Excitingly, the children will start to write some of the story and even create their own versions.

The children have worked very hard last term on their reading and writing which has been lovely to see. They are all enjoying being able to complete reading and writing challenges independently. This term we will be focusing on being able to hold a sentence in our head and write it using a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.

To bring some of the vocabulary to life we will be tasting some of the tropical fruits from story. So please inform a member of staff if your has any, allergies that we are not already aware of.

"Will she like the purple passion fruit?" thought Handa. But the pesky parrot took the passion fruit


Unfortunately, Handa's basket was now empty.


All of a sudden an angry goat charged past Handa and into a huge tangerine tree. Luckily, hundreds of tangerines then tumbled down into Handa's basket.
