A note from the Principal...

We have had another amazing week at Dashwood following the excitement of a fantastic World Book Day! There were so many fabulous costumes—thank you for all the effort everyone put in.

This week we have been asking our pupils what “having fun” at school means to them and what it looks like in practice. As part of our annual pupil voice survey, we ask whether they find school fun. This year, 64% of pupils said that school was fun. We would, of course, like this percentage to be much higher. In yesterday’s assembly, we asked pupils what they find fun at school. They shared that they particularly enjoy PE, playing outside with their friends, science experiments, school trips and group activities. The Aspirations Council will now be looking into this further to see how we can increase the amount of fun our pupils experience at school. Some ideas they have already suggested include: more sporting competitions, a chess club, more themed curriculum days, additional one-off swimming sessions and an indoor lunchtime club.

It is so important that we listen to our pupils. This is their school and we want it to be the best experience possible for them.

As you know, parent voice is essential too. We will be holding a Dashwood Action Committee meeting on Wednesday 18th March at 9am and again at 5pm. The themes for discussion will include attendance, an Aspirations overview, behaviour (including the Zones of Regulation), followed by a Q&A session where you will be able to ask any questions you may have.

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Laurel Class

Laurel Class have been learning lots about forces and why they are important in the world. We have especially been looking at what would happen if we didn't have gravity, and tried some physical exercises in class to see whether gravity was actually real! We have also been enjoying our poetry topic, recently looking at syllables, ready to create our very own Haikus! World Book Day was also another real highlight of our term so far!



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The Treehouse

The Treehouse have had a great time learning about the farm and the animals that live there. We have been talking about what they look and might feel like and we are looking forward to our trip to see if we can spot the animals we have been learning about.

We have also planted some flowers in our outside area to celebrate the start of Spring hoping the ladybirds come to visit and exploring forest school for signs of Spring.

The children have also had fun making and moving to music with Lizzie from Boogie Mites!



Cherry Nursery

Cherry Class have been enjoying the story *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*. The children listened carefully to the story and joined in with the repeated phrases, helping them to build confidence and develop their language skills.

The children have taken part in creative activities where they have used a range of different materials and techniques to make their own bear artwork. They experimented with textures, colours, and tools developing their fine motor skills. The children were very engaged and proud of the wonderful bears they created.



Plum Nursery

Plum Class have been busy taking part in activities associated with their farm topic. The children have been learning about different farm animals and the sounds they make, while also developing their fine motor skills by using playdough to create their own animals. They have been excitedly talking about their upcoming farm trip and predicting which animals they might see. In provision, they have used small world resources to build their own farms and have enjoyed exploring their new story, *Dear Farm*, changing the animals and confidently retelling the tale.



Reception

Peach and Pear classes have already enjoyed several exciting experiences this term. The children designed their own binoculars and used them during an African-inspired safari to spot different animals. They also explored the local area, observing features in our environment and beginning to compare Banbury with other places around the world.

In addition, the pupils have been enjoying stories set in Africa. They particularly loved listening to *Handa's Surprise* and had the opportunity to taste some of the fruits featured in the story.



Year 1

Year 1 have had a great start back into Term 4. In science this week, we took part in an exciting experiment where we were investigating appropriate materials for a rain shelter. We discussed the purpose of a rain shelter and therefore what properties it had to have. We made a prediction about which material we thought was best and then we put it to the test! The children thoroughly enjoyed being part of the experiment and there were wide smiles on all their faces.

It has also been lovely to see the progress in all the children's writing so far this year. The children have all worked so hard on their letter formation, phonics knowledge and building sentences. We can't wait to show you their books at parent's evening.

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Year 2

Year 2 have absolutely loved reading Fantastic Mr Fox by Roald Dahl. They showed great communication skills during a debate about who was worse - Mr Fox or the Farmers, which led to some brilliant pieces of writing.

Pupils have also enjoyed learning about food chains and ecosystems. They created their own ecosystem showing how everything connects using string. They could then discuss what one happened if certain elements were taken away due to climate change.



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Year 3

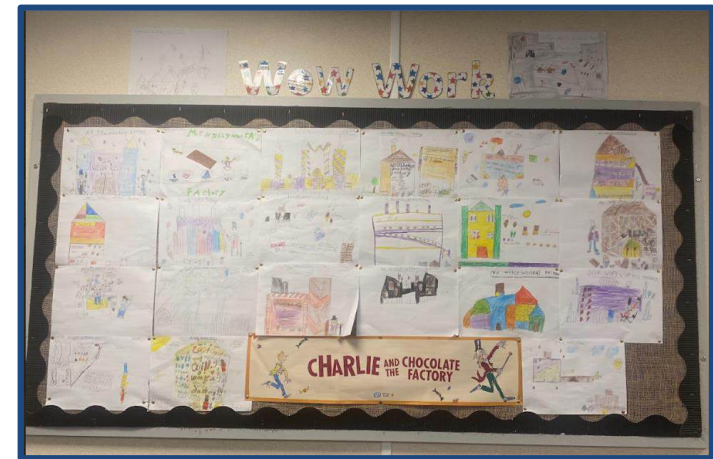
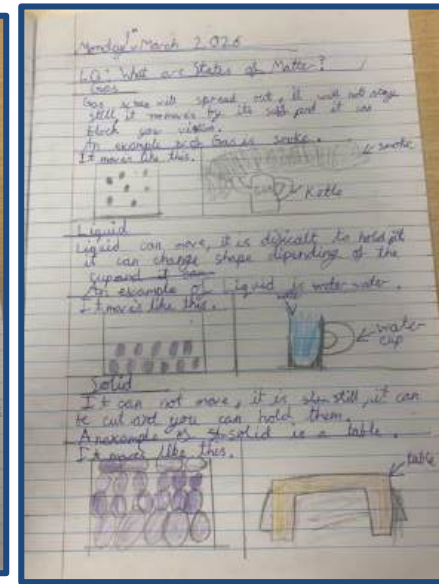
This term, the Year 3 students have decided to write Dashwood News for Mr Bennett and Mrs Zohaib. Both classes loved World Book Day and had a great time in our costumes. Our teachers were very impressed with our non-chronological reports about why reading is important and our comics. In history, we have been exploring Ancient Egypt and have been particularly interested in mummification, the pyramids and the importance of the River Nile. We have also been expanding our mathematical knowledge by learning how to measure using millimetres, centimetres and metres and at this point have measured almost everything in the school!



Year 4

What an amazing start to the term we have had! In literacy, we have started to explore Charlie and Chocolate Factory, which we will be using as an inspiration for creative writing. To start the unit, we used our imaginations to draw and scene from the book and Mrs O'Neill and Miss Hempstock were astounded by our creations!

It is an exciting term for us because we are learning all about chocolate! So far, we have looked at solids, liquids and gases including their properties and examples of each. We used this knowledge to complete an experiment using chocolate to show reversible and irreversible changes. This knowledge will help us when creating our chocolate bars!



Sports Event - Orienteering

Some pupils from year 3 and 4 took part in an orienteering event at Wykham Park. They had a great time working collaboratively to find picture clues around the field. Pupils had to use their navigation and teamwork skills to find the different clues. Pupils reported that they had a brilliant time. They were supported by Wykham Park leaders. Well done to all involved.



Year 5

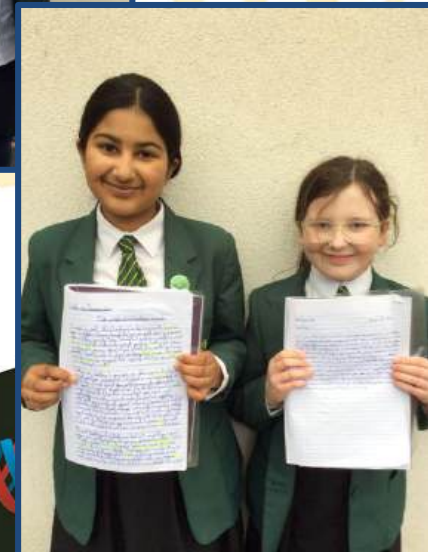
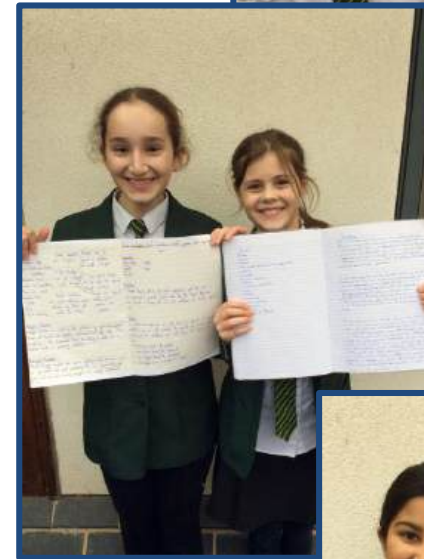
Year 5 are delving deep into Earth and Space this term. We started the term with a fun and collaborative art activity which helped the children learn the name and order of the planet as well as the fact that orbit the Sun. The art outcomes were effective and really helped our understanding. The children have also found out about the eight phases of the Moon and we are looking forward to our next collaborative art project to demonstrate our understanding of day and night in preparation for the upcoming science fair.

We really enjoyed World Book Day. There were some fabulous costumes and we found out about the many ways in which reading is important in our lives.



Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic start to Term 4! They have been enjoying their science sessions on microorganisms and have set up an experiment to test the best conditions for growing mould. They have also designed their own microbes, looked at the role hygiene plays and how we can stop the spread of superbugs. In maths, they have been working hard on finding the area, perimeter and volume of shapes and solving complex problems using algebra. They have also been using their creativity to write their own warning stories. Within these, they have been looking at using dialogue to advance the action and creating vivid setting descriptions using figurative language techniques. In PE, they have been working on developing their cricket skills including bowling, batting and fielding and also trying out some golf through the 'little sticks' programme.



ZooLab

Reception classes had an exciting start to the term as they welcomed the ZooLab rangers to launch their new topic on Africa. The children travelled on an imaginary journey across the continent and encountered some fascinating creatures, including a tortoise, millipede, snake, cockroach and tarantula. They learned about each animal's habitat, adaptations, and some interesting facts. Pupils showed great bravery, confidence, and curiosity when meeting some of the unfamiliar creatures.



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Eco-Warriors on an Eco-Mission!

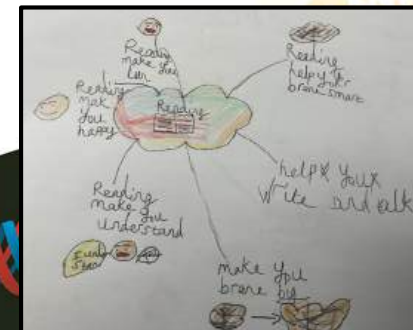
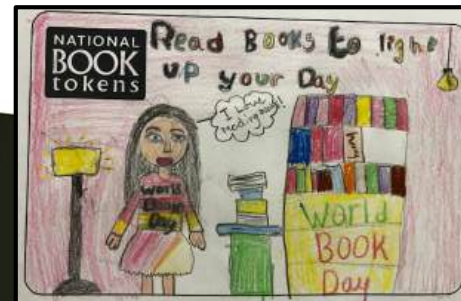
Our fantastic KS2 Eco--Warriors visited Ardley ERF which was built next to an existing landfill site. In April 2014 they announced the closure of the landfill site after 35 years so that non-recyclable waste can be used as a resource at the ERF instead.

Our Dashwood pupils really enjoyed the visitor centre and learning all about how the waste that gets sent to Ardley ERF is actually precious as it can be turned into other resources.

Classes enjoyed a buddy reading session where books were enjoyed together. Some classes put their creativity into action by designing a national book token for a competition. 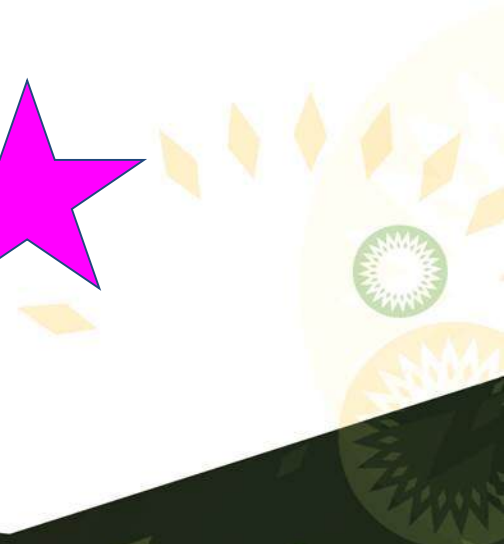
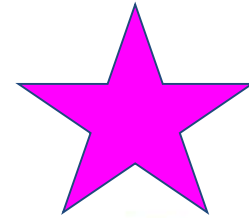
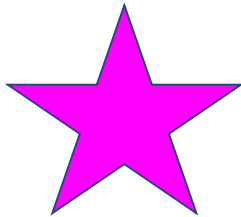
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Whole School Reminders



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Whole School Reminders

Healthy snacks at breaktime

Reminder that all breaktime snacks **must** be fresh fruit or vegetables. These can be whole or cut up pieces of fruit, a pot of grapes, raspberries, strawberries, blueberries etc, raisins, vegetable sticks - carrots, cucumber etc. No fruit substitutes such as fruit stars or wipers are allowed. Please ensure your child has these separate from their lunchbox each morning so they can eat them at break time.

Healthy lunchboxes

At Dashwood, we encourage all pupils to have a healthy lunch. Please ensure that this is a nut-free lunch (including NO chocolate spread) and is a balanced mix of foods with **one** treat only. There are some ideas on the next page.

Drinks

To support dental hygiene, please ensure that your child has **water only** in bottles in class. They can bring fruit juice/squash to have with their lunch. If they bring squash into class they will be asked to save it for their lunch and can access water from class instead.



The NHS recommends that a healthier lunchbox should include:

Starchy carbohydrates that keep your child feeling fuller for longer (wholemeal bread, pasta, potatoes, rice). **Top Tip:** If your child does not like wholemeal bread, try making a sandwich from one slice of white and one slice of wholegrain to get them used to it. Please ensure sandwich filling are also low sugar - no chocolate spread please.

Make healthy swaps to cut down on crisps, chocolate and fruit bars that are high in refined sugar. Find out more about healthier snack swaps at <https://www.nhs.uk/healthier-families/food-facts/healthier-snacks/>

Only **ONE** small treat should be included in lunchboxes if absolutely necessary. No 'grab bag' crisps or extra-large sized chocolate should be included. A portion of fruit or a low-sugar yoghurt are much healthier choices. Calories should be under 100 calories.

Include at least one portion of vegetables or salad: cherry tomatoes, cucumber, celery sticks and sliced peppers all count towards your child's '5 a day'. You could add a small pot of cream cheese for your child to dip their vegetables in.



At Dashwood Banbury Academy, we believe that school meals are a great choice for your child, but if you choose to make a packed lunch for them instead, here are some tips for providing a healthier lunchbox. Please help your child to live a healthy life.



Include fresh fruit that is in season: chopped apple, raspberries, strawberries, blackberries, blueberries and melon, all make great snacks too. **Top Tip:** add a squeeze of lemon juice to chopped fruit to stop it from going brown.

Include a source of protein such as beans and pulses; eggs; meat; cheese; and fish.



REMEMBER: We are a NUT-FREE school.

Please **NO** peanut butter, chocolate spread or nuts as snacks as some of our children and staff members have severe allergies.

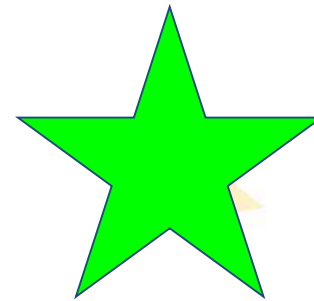

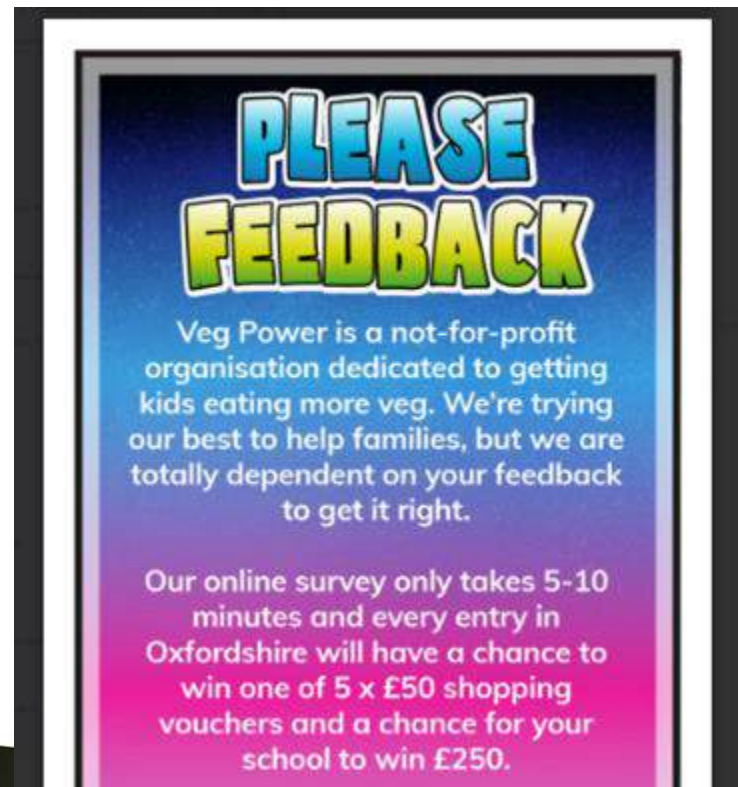

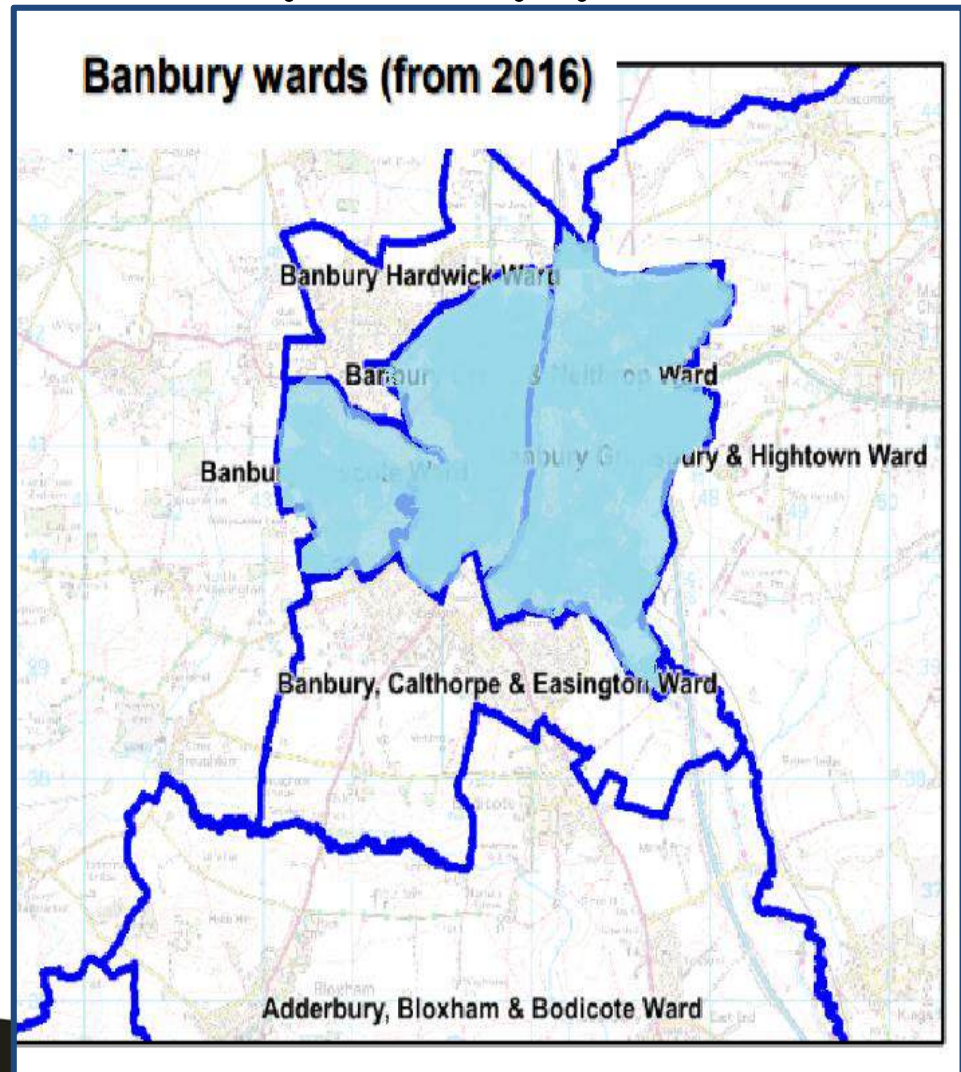
